#### Good Neighbours Reminders

#### New N4 Number

If you have received an N4 Form (a Notice to Terminate Early For Non-Payment of Rent), here's what you should do, depending on your situation:

• If you did, in fact, pay your rent before you received the notice, please see your Building Manager immediately, with proof of your payment.

If you have not paid your rent, make sure your payment is made before the Termination Date set out in the Notice to avoid legal action.
If you believe that the monthly rent amount shown on your notice is incorrect, see your Building Manager with proof of the correct amount.

In all cases, it's a good idea to check with your Building Manager, before the termination date on your notice, to confirm that your payment was received and posted to your account.

If you have any questions regarding your N4 notice, please leave a message at 647-259-4311, and someone will return your call within 72 hours.
