

Recycling Program for Toronto Buildings

Residents of MetCap Living buildings in Toronto are required to participate in the City of Toronto's newly expanded recycling program. Including apartment tenants in the program will put the City closer to achieving its 70 percent waste-diversion target by 2010. We are very pleased to be able to contribute to that impressive goal.

Information specific to each building is detailed in a letter distributed to residents. If you haven't received your recycling information or bins, don't worry; they will be delivered soon. If you have misplaced your letter, contact your building manager to receive another copy. Details related to the location of recycling containers vary from building to building, but other information can be summed up as follows:

- A list of recyclable materials was provided with the letter you
 received about the introduction of the recycling program. Any
 waste item not on the list is not recyclable and should be put
 in the garbage. Non-recyclables in the recycling containers are
 considered contaminants and could cause the whole load to be
 treated as garbage.
- You do not have to sort your recyclables. Items will be sorted and separated by the City at its processing facility.
- Corrugated cardboard should be flattened and tied into 2' x 2' x 1' bundles that are to be placed in the recycling area of your building.

Taking part in the recycling program in your building is easy. Use the bin in your suite until it's full, then empty it in a container in the recycling area. The program is designed to be convenient to ensure that people participate. Please join in!

Available cars range from Mini Coopers to passenger vans, and include luxury models and hybrids. Members can choose to offset the CO2 emissions from their driving for an extra five cents per kilometre.

Good Neighbours

1.Pigeons Don't Belong on Balconies – Please deter pigeons from nesting on your balcony. If you discover that pigeons are making a home there, please let your building manager know. Remember, pigeons carry disease that could make you or your neighbours ill.

- **2.Apartment Living** *Can* **be for the Dogs!** —While it's a little more complicated having a dog in a building than it is in a house, it can be done well by people who keep their dogs' and their neighbours' needs in mind. Keep your dog on a leash when it's not in your suite and, to avoid "accidents" in the building, time your walks to meet your dog's needs. Always stoop and scoop! If an urgent need to get outside strikes your dog and you can't make it to the building's grounds, use the balcony but be sure to clean it immediately afterwards. And when you clean it, remember your neighbours below!
- **3.Windows and Warm Weather** Please be sure to contact your building manager to get a consent form if you want to install a portable air conditioner in your suite. Also, inform the building manager if any of your windows are missing screens or restrictors, as these are essential safety requirements.
