MetCap Memo

Balcony Cleaning and Safety

Keep these tips in mind as the weather warms:

- Remove objects from your balcony that children could climb on.
- Get rid of anything that could collect water and serve as breeding ground for mosquitoes.
- Ensure that you can lock the screen door that leads to your balcony if small children are around.
- Don't feed pigeons on your balcony or allow them to nest there. Talk to your Resident Manager about netting if you're having a problem with pigeons.
- ❖ Prevent pets from "doing their business" on the balcony. If you can't always take your dog outside when it needs to go, set up an absorbent-litter tray, such as the Pet Patio Potty™, available at www.doggysolutions.com.
- Never throw anything, including lit cigarettes, off the balcony.
- Put garbage especially food where it belongs, not on your balcony, where it can attract flies.

Another important safety must: make sure that all of your windows have screens and, where necessary, window restrictors (child safety locks). If your windows are missing these items, get in touch with your Resident Manager to schedule a fix.

Caring for Your Dog: Having a dog in an apartment building can keep you busy. Just ensuring that it gets out when it needs to means that you II be going outside a few times a day. Good exercise and fresh air, right? Well, those are the good things. Not so good is the poop, especially if you happen to step in some! Please stoop and scoop to clean up after your pet. And, if your dog is a barker, keep your neighbours in mind (along with the fine you could receive from the City!); do some research to figure out why it's barking and how to stop it. Speaking of Noise: Between 11:00 pm and 7:00 am, when most of us are sleeping, local by-laws impose noise limitations to prevent loud disruptions. Please keep your noise down, especially during these hours, to ensure that your neighbours can get the sleep they need. If you are bothered by someone s noise outside of regular business hours, please contact building security, if applicable, or the police, not building staff. If you do want to let staff know about the incident, please submit your complaint in writing the next day.

Maintenance Requests: If you have work to be done in your apartment, including pest control, you II need to submit a maintenance request form to your Resident Manager. The forms are available from the Resident Manager and on the MetCap website; they are also provided in the welcome packages given to all new residents. Your Resident Manager will also give you policy information if you need it.

On a Similar Note: If you plan to cancel your parking space or terminate your lease, please be sure to give your Resident Manager 60 days notice. That way, you give us time to lease the space again to ensure that you re not held liable for rental fees after you leave.


